Criteria for Registration in Clinical Oncology

Any doctor can request to be registered in Clinical Oncology specialist if he/she fulfils ALL the following requirements:

1.Fully Registered with the Malaysian Medical Council with current Annual Practicing (APC), AND

2. A recognised postgraduate qualification

- 2.1 Master of Clinical Oncology, UM
- 2.2 Fellow of the Royal College of Radiologist (FRCR)
- 2.3 Fellow of the Faculty of Radiologists and Radiotherapists of the Royal College of Surgeons of Ireland (FFRRCSI)
- 2.4 Diploma in Medical Radiotherapy (DMRT) United Kingdom, before 1.1.94
- 2.5 Any other equivalent qualifications as recommended by the Clinical Oncology Specialty Board on a case-to-case basis.

3. Completed specialty training in recognised centres

- 3.1 Basic Specialist Training shall be for a period of not less than 4 years in recognized training centres.
- 3.2 Post-Qualification Training shall be for a period of not less than one(1) year. Government doctors must be gazetted. Equivalent rules will be applicable to university medical lecturers.
- 3.3 An application that does not conform to the above requirement shall be reviewed on a case-to-case basis by the Clinical Oncology Specialty Board.

4. Evidence of satisfactory specialty training as supported by:

- 4.1 Evidence of satisfactory completion of the training programmes
- 4.2 Reports from supervisor (s) / trainer (s) on satisfactory achievement of different stages of training
- 5. Notwithstanding the above, the SSC may stipulate any conditions, including additional training or work experience, on the applicant if deemed necessary
