

Criteria for Registration in Gastroenterology and Hepatology

Any doctor can request to be registered as a specialist in Gastroenterology and Hepatology if he/she fulfils ALL the following requirements:

1. Fully registered with the Malaysian Medical Council with current Annual Practicing Certificate (APC).

2. Recognised postgraduate qualifications.

2.1. Holds a recognised basic postgraduate qualification in Internal Medicine:

- i. Sarjana Perubatan Dalaman, Universiti Malaya
- ii. Sarjana Perubatan (Perubatan Dalaman), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia
- iii. Doktor Perubatan Penyakit Dalaman, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, from June 2013
- iv. Sarjana Perubatan (Perubatan Penyakit Dalam), Universiti Sains Malaysia
- v. Sarjana Perubatan (Perubatan Dalaman), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) from 6.12.2011
- vi. Sarjana Perubatan (Perubatan Dalaman), Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) from 1.10.2014
- vii. Master of Medicine (Internal Medicine), Universiti Islam Antarabangsa (UIAM) from 9.6.2015
- viii. Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians
- ix. MRCP (UK) / MRCP(Ireland)
- x. Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians, Canada
- xi. Diplomate from the American Board of Internal Medicine
- xii. Certificate of Specialization in Internal Medicine, University of Ghent, Belgium
- xiii. Any other qualification apart from those listed above will be determined on a case to case basis by the NSR committee

AND

2.2 Completed training in the Gastroenterology & Hepatology Fellowship Programme with satisfactory completion of all components of the approved training in centres accredited by the Ministry of Health Malaysia.

2.3 Recognised overseas qualifications.

2.3.1 Posses a postgraduate qualification in Gastroenterology & Hepatology recognised by the NSR:

- a) CCT/CCST in Gastroenterology by General Medical Council, UK
- b) CSCST in Gastroenterology, RCP (Ireland)
- c) Diplomate in American Board of Gastroenterology
- d) Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians (Gastroenterology)
- e) Certificate of Specialist Accreditation in Gastroenterology by Specialist Accreditation Body (SAB), Ministry of Health, Singapore
- f) *Adult/Paediatric Gastroenterology Training, Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada*
- g) Any other recognised qualifications approved by SSC by case to case basis

2.4 Training in gastroenterology and hepatology programs for a minimum of 3 years in other countries or centres will be considered for credentialing on a case-to-case basis with documentary proof of their training. Recognized training programmes will be reviewed from time-to-time by the committee.

2.5 The SSC may consider applications on a case to case basis from applicants who, while not possessing any of the above qualifications or the required training, are recognised by their peers as having exceptional expertise in the field of Gastroenterology and Hepatology.

3. Evidence of satisfactory subspecialty training as supported by:

- 3.1 Certificate /Letter of satisfactory completion of training
- 3.2 Supervisory Reports
- 3.3 Log of Cases of procedures on core competencies (for applicants working overseas)

4. Notwithstanding the above, the SSC may stipulate any condition, including additional training or work experience, on the applicant if deemed necessary.
