

Criteria for Registration as a Neurologist

A doctor may apply to be registered as a Neurologist if he/she fulfills the following requirements:

1. Fully Registered with the Malaysian Medical Council with current Annual Practicing Certificate (APC), AND

2. Holds a recognised basic postgraduate qualification in Internal Medicine:

- 2.1 Member of the Royal College of Physicians, UK (MRCP UK)
- 2.2 Member of the Royal College of Physicians, Ireland (MRCP Ire)
- 2.3 Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians (FRACP)
- 2.4 Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Canada (FRCP Canada)
- 2.5 Any M.Med (Int.Med) degree from a Malaysian University approved by the Specialty Subcommittee SSC
- 2.6 Diplomate from the American Board of Internal Medicine
- 2.7 Certificate of Specialization in Internal Medicine, University of Ghent, Belgium
- 2.8 Any other recognized qualification on a case to case basis.

3. Completed specialty training in recognised centres

- 3.1 A total duration of three (3) years, one of which may be spent in an approved overseas centre(s)
- 3.2 Successfully completed the minimum numbers of cases seen and procedures performed required for competency and proficiency
- 3.3 Upon completion of training, trainee should also complete a minimum of 1 research project

4. Evidence of satisfactory subspecialty training as supported by:

- 4.1 Certificate /Letter of satisfactory completion of training
- 4.2 Logbook
 - Trainees shall maintain a logbook to record clinical procedures done, clinical neurophysiology activities performed, CME activities, QA activities, publication and participation in professional meetings (see credentialing of procedures in neurology appendix 1B) throughout the 3 years of training.
- 4.3 Supervisory Reports
- 4.4 Successfully pass an Exit Viva Evaluation approved by the SSC

5. Notwithstanding the above, the SSC may stipulate any conditions, including additional training or work experience, on the applicant if deemed necessary

6. The Neurology registration may be approved by the SSC in special circumstances on a case to case basis
