

Appendix A

Check-list to help assess clinical competency of Paediatric Gastroenterology trainee by supervisor

(Based on 'A Framework of Competencies for Core Higher Specialist Training in Paediatrics,' Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health, October 2005)

A paediatric gastroenterologist should:-

- have the knowledge and skills to be able to assess and manage patients with common gastroenterological problems in acute and outpatient settings
- understand the role of interventional procedures (such as upper gastrointestinal endoscopy and colonoscopy) in the investigation of gastroenterological diseases

Acute Presentations

- Acute abdominal pain
- Acute diarrhea and/or vomiting
- Jaundice
- Upper and lower gastrointestinal bleeding
- Abdominal distension
- Acute liver failure
- Congenital gastrointestinal abnormalities
- Gastro-esophageal reflux and esophagitis

Out-patient presentations

- Chronic or recurrent abdominal pain
- Chronic diarrhea and/or vomiting
- Constipation with or without soiling
- Dysphagia
- Malabsorption
- Malnutrition
- Iron deficiency anaemia
